To take admission in DGO (Diploma in Prasuti & Striroga) – Ayurveda, must follow the steps based on the type of institute (Government or Private).

1. Eligibility Criteria

Criteria	Details
Educational Qualification	BAMS (Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery)
Internship	Must have completed the 1-year compulsory rotatory internship
Registration	Registered with State/CCIM/NCISM Ayurvedic Medical Council

2. Admission Process - Government/Deemed/Recognized Institutes

Most top Ayurvedic colleges like AIIA (Delhi), NIA (Jaipur), Bharati Vidyapeeth (Pune), etc., take admission via AIAPGET.

Step	Description	
Step 1	Appear for AIAPGET (All India AYUSH Postgraduate Entrance Test) conducted by NTA.	
Step 2	Check the cutoff marks and rank under your category.	
	Participate in centralized counseling conducted by AACCC (AYUSH Admissions Central Counseling Committee) on aaccc.gov.in	
Step 4	Select your desired college & DGO (Prasuti & Striroga) seat during counseling.	
Step 5	Report to the allotted college with original documents & fees.	

3. Admission in Private Institutes (Direct/Management Quota)

Some private Ayurvedic colleges offer **direct admission** or **management quota** seats if AIAPGET seat is not filled.

Step	Description
Contact College Directly	Reach out to institutes like SS Ayurveda, Sewa College, etc.
Submit Documents	BAMS mark sheets, internship certificate, registration certificate, ID proofs.
Pay Fees	As per college norms (usually ₹50,000 to ₹2 lakhs/year).
Attend Counseling	May be internal or state-level. Some institutes take interviews.
