ABOUT THE COURSE

We need trained health care professionals at every stage for effective delivery of health care services. To achieve the universal health coverage sufficient manpower expertise at community level is very much required. It is evident that there is a need to have an ideal health workforce comprising of multi-layered and multi-skilled professionals offering number health care services. Physicians/Doctors and nurses are best known for it. However, a number of allied health professionals and community level health workers are also an integral part of effective health care delivery.

Common challenges to teamwork in healthcare are very common. There is a need to develop clarity on work coordination with the primary care team of the CHOS. Each team member of a team brings with them their unique personality, values, and communication preferences, which affects how team members interact and ultimately their ability to reach the shared goals. This training program will help the CHOs to learn various skills and approaches and enhance their professional efficacy required for effective health care management and service delivery.

As the health care system continues to experience growing strain on resources including limited time and access to providers, we need to consider new and creative opportunities to expand and enhance the workforce. Critical workforces such as Community Health Officers are one approach to simultaneously build upon community infrastructure and enhance the capacity of the health care workforce. The CHOs have become an important part of the health care workforce and provide an opportunity for health care systems to meaningfully address disparities and create a more diverse and culturally competent workforce. It is evident that the CHOs are recruited based on their primary qualification with an added qualification i.e.

‘Certificate in community Health’ which is offered by IGNOU. As they are required to discharge a number professional activities as a part of their job profile they need to be oriented and trained on regular interval to enhance their professional competencies to deliver better and effective health care services. Keeping this in view it is proposed to conduct a 5 days training course on ‘Time and Task Management of Community Health Officers working at Ayushman Arogya Mandir for Effective Health Care Management’. The training course will enhance the professional productivity of the CHOs by familiarizing them with new techniques and innovations in the field of health sector and their application in work management specifically the Time and Task management.

GENERAL OBJECTIVE

To enhance the professional competency of the Community Health Officers (CHOs) by familiarizing them with the techniques and approaches of time and task management for effective health care management and delivery.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

On completion of the course the participants will be able to:

- Identify the time stealers/wasters and adopt strategies for reducing them
- Recognize the difference between urgent task and important task and handle them appropriately through scheduling, planning and prioritizing
- Prepare the plan and arrange daily activities in a productive way by efficiently delegating the task
- Utilize Technology efficiently to save time and learn effective ways of handling Paperwork
- Explain the skills of work place and interpersonal communication for effective team management
- Organize the workstation and workflow by better using the time and task
